The recent fall of plaster from the north wall in the sanctuary has meant we have had to temporarily close St Mary's during the day, to comply with Safety regulations.

We have set the wheels in motion for this to be made safe ASAP. "Luckily" our architect was on site in a meeting with Martyn one of our church wardens, and this has helped speed up the process. The first quote we received for making the area safe was a bit high (£2,300 plus vat), but I'm pleased to relate that we have now secured another company (through the architect), for the much more realistic fee of £600. Plus vat. The work should be completed by the first week of July, and the church can remain open again once it is safe.

Please note, that we are still recommending that no one works alone in the church while it is open to the public, and that teams of two should lock it. This is again in order to keep everyone safe after recent episodes of anti-social behaviour from a visitor.



North Porch and lay- by planning

One of the long-term projects our PCC has been working on, is to improve the accessibility of the North porch by extending and partially redesigning it. This will make it easier for wheelchair users and people with mobility issues as well as families with buggies to enter the building. The proposed North Porch improvements will be linked to levelling works on the footpath and the creation of a lay-by to allow people to park safely while they unload wheelchairs and mobility aids / buggies etc. Full details of this proposal can be found on the three rivers website as we are now applying for planning permission for this project. Please can our church members support this application by reading the notes below and following their guidance ...

The PCC would welcome the support of members of the congregation for this proposal. The best way to support the proposal is by commenting on the current planning application and giving it your support.

The Application Number is 25/0883/FUL and can be viewed on Three Rivers website. When commenting I would suggest making the following points.

The description of development is 'Construction of porch extension and associated landscaping works including drop off lay-by and resurfacing pathways.'

When commenting give the application reference number & make it clear that you support the proposal. Providing level access via the extended North porch to the church will greatly benefit many in our congregation as well as other users of and visitors to the church

The proposed drop off point with a level path to the North porch will further ease access and avoid the need for people to be dropped off outside The Feathers public house where parking restrictions are in place.

The lay-by would also be available for the use of hearses and wedding cars to drop off /pick up. Currently such vehicles park illegally outside The Feathers

The design of the North porch, retains all the existing porch apart from the current outer porch door and will offer a much more welcoming entrance to the church.

The official deadline for comments is 2nd July, but it should be possible to leave comments for a day or two after the deadline.

Baptisms and Weddings

Baptism and Wedding bookings continue to increase.

We currently have 7 weddings in the process of being booked and will have held at least 15 baptisms by November of this year, though as enquiries continue to come in that figure is set to rise. Please pray for the continuing growth of this ministry and the growing connection with our communities
