**Church Giving at St Mary's: Time and Talents
2021 Campaign: *What can I give him?***

I have been struck in the past weeks of Christmas and Epiphany by the words, *What can I give Him* which come from the hymn, *In the bleak mid-winter*. The response to these words is, as we will well know, *give my heart* and I have considered these words in light of the decision of the UCC that this year's Church Giving Sunday should focus on how we each give of our Time and Talents, our gifts and skills, in the service of God and God's church. What does *give my heart* mean? We sing it each year, but where does it take us?

For some, *give my heart* will mean greater dedication to prayer and worship, for others it will mean greater dedication to service. As you ponder what *give my heart* might mean for you, I invite you to consider some practical examples of how you might use your God-given gifts and skills, your Time and Talents, to deepen your commitment to God through life at St Mary's and, through this, your discipleship and faith. Enclosed with this letter is a leaflet giving a whole host of activities with which we can be involved. I have followed the three themes we use for our Mission Action Plan to hang these on so that there is a wide spread of actions available to us all. God calls each one of us: you, me, everyone. There really is an activity for everyone.

The current financial situation

Having initially decided that this year's Church Giving should concentrate on Time and Talents, the reality of the current financial situation means that no-one at St Mary's can ignore the fact that the income from church members has not covered our expenditure for some years means we also need to reflect on our finances in this letter too.

The United Church Council (UCC) has continued to make very difficult decisions to try to 'balance the books'. For a second year,

St Mary's is carrying forward a substantial deficit - this year of £35,000. There is no doubt people not being able to attend on a Sunday has affected our income, alongside the Church Centre income plummeting. On the other side of these losses was the remarkable generosity of individuals who gave a total of £6,635 in one-off donations.

Sadly, we have had to again reduce the amount given to Charities from our Planned Giving. For 2021, only 10% will be given away. Should the response to this year's Church Giving Campaign be as successful as we hope, the proposal is that we will give away what has been our norm, 20% of our Planned Giving income. This is wholly dependant on the bottom-line figures at the end of the year though.

We need our overall income to increase by at least 10% in order to return to where we were a few years ago. The only place this increase in income is going to come from is from each of us at St Mary's.

Looking forward

Giving of our Time and Talents, working together as the body of Christ, increases our sense of belonging. Getting to knowing others who make up our worshipping community is key to being a disciple of Christ. Getting to know one another, seeing what is good in one another and celebrating these things, as well as learning from them and sharing more deeply, is a great gift we are given by being part of the body of Christ. The list of things in the accompanying leaflet is given for each of us to reflect on and pray with and respond to. Please do reflect, pray and respond - especially to some of the practical things. Use this letter as a rallying call to greater commitment, fuller discipleship, new possibilities for us all - personally and as a household of faith.

Also, reflect, pray and respond with regard to the amount of money you give to St Mary's. As we have seen this past year, we cannot rely on unpredictable income streams such as rental income or bequests to pay our regular bills.

How much should you give?

Of your life, as a child of God... everything! This does *not* mean you have to become a Nun/Monk/Priest, worry not! What it does mean though is that the choices you make as to how you live your life of faith *are* important. How much of your time is given to the life of the church? Fully, wholly, unselfishly. The Covenant Service Prayer is a wonderful reminder of all that we have been given and all that we are asked to give. Look at the enclosed activities, and ask for God's guidance as to how you should respond.

Remember where I began... *What can I give him?* What would giving your heart look like - in Time and Talents, as well as financially?

If our Income through Planned Giving equalled our Expenditure, any additional money through rental etc. would be a bonus and thus allow us to return to being able to do the things we have for so long taken as read. In addition, new things could happen - such as employing a Children's and Family Worker.

Our Income through giving needs to increase by at least 10% for us to even attempt to balance our books. 'Money is the muscle of mission' was something I heard recently. Our money makes mission possible: bringing people into the household of faith.

What next?

Reflect: *On your own Time and Talents, gifts and skills, financial resources.*

Pray: *Ask God to show you how to respond with a generous heart.*

Respond: *Give of your time, give of your talents, give of your money. Give of and from your heart.*
